This document notifies you that —

- 1. The applicant **Nuki Aldridge (Nicholas Smith)** will on 31 March 2017 apply to the court for a recognition order under s 98 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011 ("the Act").
- 2. The applicant will seek a recognition order for Customary Marine Title ("CMT") under the requirements of s 58 of the Act.
- 3. The applicant will seek a recognition order for Protected Customary Rights ("PCR(s)") under the requirements of s 51(1) of the Act.

The Applicant Group

- 4. The applicant group is Te-Whānau-ō-Rataroa, a whānau of Ngāti Uru, Ngāti Pakahi and Te Tahawai of Ngāpuhi.
- 5. Te-Whānau-ō-Rataroa are located at Whangaroa.

Representative of Applicant Group

6. The person who will be the representative of the applicant group and the holder of the order is Nuki Aldridge.

Specific Area to which Application Relates

- 9. The common marine and coastal area (as defined in s 9 of the Act) to which this application relates is the area that is bounded:
 - On the landward side by the line of mean high-water a. springs;
 - b. On the seaward side by the outer limits of the territorial sea;
 - On the north-western side by a line that extends from the C. coast abutting Taupuke Point 1 to the outer limits of the territorial sea;
 - On the south-eastern side by a line that extends from the d. coast abutting Taupaki Pā and Waikukupa Reserve² to the outer limits of the territorial sea;

e. And every area of the common marine and coastal area within those four boundaries.

("the specified area")

- 10. The area includes the common marine and coastal area surrounding Mahinepua Island.
- 11. A map of the specified area is at **Page 2** of the Exhibit accompanying the affidavit of Nicholas Smith.
- 12. The applicant group reserves the right to amend the specified area in light of any further evidence and/or historical research that may arise in the course of these proceedings.

Grounds for CMT Application

- 13. The applicant group holds the specified area in accordance with tikanga.
- 14. The applicant group has exclusively used and occupied the specified area from at least 1840 until the present day.
- 15. Title to the specified area has not been extinguished as a matter of law.
- 16. Further grounds in support of the CMT application are contained in the attached affidavit of Nicholas Smith, these further grounds include that:
 - a. The applicant group owns land abutting the specified area and have done so, without substantial interruption, from 1873 to the present day; and
 - b. The applicant group and its members exercise non-commercial customary fishing rights in the specified area, and have done so from 1873 to the present day.

Description of PCRs

Access to Mahinepua Island

- 17. The applicant group have harvested tio (oysters) located on Mahinepua Island.
- 18. The applicant group have also fished (kahawai, snapper, kingfish, parore, and trevalley), dived, harvested, and gathered mutton birds from Mahinepua Island and its surrounds.
- 19. The applicant group requires access to Mahinepua Island to continue exercising these customary rights.

Access to Taupo Bay

- 20. The applicant group have oyster and mutton-bird reserves in Taupo Bay.
- 21. The applicant group also have rights to get koura and fish from the moana in Taupo Bay.
- 22. The applicant group had a right of way to access and exercise these rights in Taupo Bay.
- 23. The applicant group requires access to Taupo Bay to continue exercising these customary rights.

Kaitiaki

- 24. The Applicant Group have practiced kaitiaki responsibilities in and around the specified area.
- 25. The kaitiaki role involves, in part, the passing on of Maori lore and ecological wisdom to the younger generations.
- 26. The kaitiaki role of the Applicant Group also involves conservation, protection and supervision of the specified area.

27. The Applicant Group requires access to the specified area so that its members can continue this customary supervisory and protective role.

Grounds for PCR Application

- 28. The PCRs, described above at paragraph [17-27], have;
 - a. Been exercised before and since 1840;
 - b. Continued to be exercised by Te-Whānau-ō-Rātāroa in accordance with tikanga; and
 - c. Not been extinguished as a matter of law.

Affidavit in Support of Application

29. As stated above, the application is accompanied, and supported by, the affidavit of Nicholas Smith.
