This document notifies you that:

1. Peter Riki Mihaere apply to the High Court for an order pursuant to s98 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Tactual Moana) Act 2011 ("the Act") to recognise the customary marine title and/or protected customary rights of Ngati Kurupakiaka/ Ngati Tauira.

Protected Customary Rights

- 2. Ngati Kurupakiaka/Ngai Tauira ancestors utilised the common marine and coastal area for
 - non-commercial fishing (utilising nets, hinaki, hand-lines, reti board, surf cast, long lines, traditional contiki, kite, spear, gaf, tickle, ringaringa, waka trawling, to catch Mullet, Snapper (tamure), kahawai, Inanga - Whitebait, smelt, patiki (flounder) gurnard, King Fish, herrings, Shark (mango), eels and other fish).
 - non-commercial seeding and harvesting of shellfish (including pipi, whetiko, ngupara, cockles, mussels, toheroa, a type of tuatua, and others).
 - activities related to spiritual practices (such as rahui and others);

- planting and cultivating plant species in CMCA wet margins (such as flax, tī kouka, pingao and others);
- gathering edible and aquatic plants;
- extracting non-nationalised minerals for non-commercial purposes;
- collecting driftwood and other natural resources for noncommercial purposes;
- temporary camp-sites for ceremonial activities in the CMCA;
- tauranga waka.
- Traditional practices e.g. healing, resource gathering and other.
- Traditonal Seasonal Exchange and other activities

The Applicant Group:

3. Ngati Kurupakiaka/Ngai Tauira, Te Aitanga a Puata Whanau/Hapu whakapapa to Maui Potiki, Tauira, Rongokokako, Tahu Potiki, Puata, Kahungunu, Rongomaiwahine, Te Rauhina, Hinekakaho i Te Rangi, Te Kawiti (Kauiti), Te Ure o T O, Te O Tane, and many other Tipuna, and link to the application area. Peter Riki Mihaere was appointed to make this application for and on behalf of the Ngati Kurupakiaka, Te Aitanga a Puata and Ngai Tauira and ors on Sunday 2 April 2017.

Area to which the application relates:

- 4. The area to which this application relates is the common marine and coastal area (as defined in s9 of the Act) that is bounded:
 - a. on the landward side by the line of mean high-water springs;
 - b. on the seaward side by the outer limits of the territorial sea;
 - c. on the north eastward side of the Te Wairoa River bar is to Hikakawa Bluff then extended to Waikokopu stream, and south/westward side from the river mouth to Poututu stream by a line that extends from the coast abutting the southwest side of Poututu stream to Cape Kidnappers peninsular to the outer limits of the territorial sea;

Grounds on which the protected customary rights order is sought:

- 5. The grounds on which this order is sought are that:
 - a. Te Aitanga a Puata, Ngati Kurupakiaka, Ngai Tauira being a coastal group has relied heavily on Mullet, kahawai, Inanga Whitebait, smelt, patiki (flounder), gurnard, herrings Snapper (tamure), kahawai, eels and other fish; pipi, whetiko, ngupara, cockles, mussels, toheroa, a type of tuatua, pupu and others and wetland food stocks foraged by whānau in the estuaries and coastal margins; and
 - b. Te Aitanga a Puata, Ngati Kurupakiaka, Ngati Tauira fishermen sought the deep water fish King Fish, Snapper, Shark (Mango), Gurnard, Elephant Tuna, Sword Fish, Moki, Orange Ruffy, John Dory, Frost fish, Albacore, GT, Bass, Blue nose, Hapuka, Hoki, and others that were not available around the inner shoreline; and
 - c. Te Aitanga a Puata, Ngati Kurupakiaka, Ngati Tauira also undertakes the following activities in the common marine and coastal area: rongoā, kairangi (bird snaring etc), duck shooting transfer of knowledge of hapu marine culture, feeding the Whanau and Hapu, seasonal kaimoana exchange, access to gardens on land, bird snaring, tangihana, social interaction, manaakitanga a Ngati Kurupakiaka/Te Aitanga a Puata/Ngati Tauira has undertaken these activities listed above since **prior to or at 1840** and continues to undertake these activities in the application area, albeit in some instances using modern equipment, and in accordance with tikanga.
 - d. Ngati Kurupakiaka/Te Aitanga a Puata/Ngati Tauira will provide more information once funding for research and legal representation is secured.

Grounds on which the customary marine title application is made:

- 6. The grounds on which this order is sought are that:
 - a. Ngati Kurupakiaka/Te Aitanga a Puata/Ngati Tauira has held the application area in accordance with tikanga since pre 1840.
 - b. Ngati Kurupakiaka/Te Aitanga a Puata/Ngati Tauira has exclusively used along with other Hapu and occupied the application area from pre 1840 to the present day without substantial interruption.
- 7. Ngati Kurupakiaka/Te Aitanga a Puata/Ngati Tauira will provide more information once funding for research and legal representation is secured.
- 8. At this stage we have no legal representation due to lack of funding and we are also low on human resource and have resorted to prepare and file this application ourselves this afternoon. Therefore I ask for leniency in regards this application.
