- 1. The Applicant Malcolm J. Kingi, on behalf of Ngai Tāhū O Mohaka-Waikare will, on 3 April 2017, apply to the Court for a recognition order under s 98 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011 ("the Act").
- 2. The Applicant will seek a recognition order for Customary Marine Title ("CMT") under the requirements of s 58 of the Act.
- The Applicant will seek to include recognition of wāhi tapu and wāhi tapu areas in a CMT order under s 78 of the Act.
- 4. The Applicant will seek a recognition order for Protected Customary Rights ("PCRs") under the requirements of section 51(1) of the Act.

The Applicant Group

- 5. The Applicant Group is Ngai Tāhū O Mohaka-Waikare.
- 6. Ngai Tāhū O Mohaka-Waikare is located in the Hawkes Bay on the East Coast of the North Island of New Zealand.

Specified Area to which Application Relates

- 10. The common marine and coastal area to which this application relates is a coastline in Hawkes Bay on the east coast of the North Island starting at the mouth of the Mohaka River in the South to the mouth of the Waiohinganga River or Esk River in the North, beginning at the line of mean high tide springs and extending to the outer limits of the Territorial Sea seaward ("the specified area").
- 11. **Attached** to this application and marked 'A' is a map of the specified area.

Grounds for CMT Application

- 12. The specified area has been held by Ngai Tāhū O Mohaka-Waikare in accordance with tikanga since 1840.
- 13. Title to the specified area has not been extinguished as a matter of law.
- 14. Further grounds in support of the CMT application are contained in the attached affidavit of Malcolm J. Kingi ("the affidavit")

Wāhi Tapu

- 15. Various wāhi tapu and wāhi tapu areas, of importance to Ngai Tāhū O Mohaka-Waikare are located within the specified area.
- 16. If this application for a CMT recognition order is successful, Ngai Tāhū O Mohaka-Waikare will seek to include recognition of these wāhi tapu as part of the order under s 78 of the Act.
- 17. As the wāhi tapu are of an ancient nature, for the purposes of this application the Applicant Group reserves the right to include any wāhi tapu in a recognition order for CMT, after a pukenga has been consulted, and after historical research is carried out.

Description of PCRs

Kaitiaki

- 18. The Applicant Group have practiced kaitiaki responsibilities in and around the specified area.
- 19. The kaitiaki role involves, in part, the passing on of Maori lore and ecological wisdom to the younger generations.
- 20. The kaitiaki role of the Applicant Group also involves conservation, protection and supervision of the specified area.
- 21. The Applicant Group requires access to the specified area so that its members can continue this customary supervisory and protective role.

Kaimoana Gathering and Protection

- 22. The Applicant Group gathers kaimoana as a food source for non-commercial purposes.
- 23. The Applicant Group also plays a conservation/kaitiaki role in relation to the protection and management of Kaimoana in the specified area.



Grounds for PCR Application

- 24. The PCRs described above at paragraphs [18] – [28], have;
 - Been exercised since 1840; a.
 - Continue to be exercised by members of Ngai Tāhū O Mohakab. Waikare in the specified area in accordance with tikanga; and
 - C. Are not extinguished as a matter of law.
